Club Life

Charter remains a place where students can thrive socially and academically. Our membership connectiveness, inclusivity, and enthusiasm is clearly visible in our dining room every day, and regular faculty and alumni-hosted forums during meals encourage open, thought-provoking conversation. Throughout the club, Charter members study throughout the day in a variety of spaces. We hold a range of events including study breaks, movie and TV viewings, and live performances. Our upcoming social calendar includes our sixth biannual Programming Cup, game tournaments, and House Parties.

Technology

Our popular computer cluster has six multi-monitor computers with top-of-the-line graphics and processors that are maintained regularly by our Tech Chair. In addition, Charter's new website gave members and prospective members a centralized online system to interact with the club. It is maintained by a team of undergraduates in the club. The website focuses on improving the sophomore and member experience with Club events and menus. Last year we rolled out our webstore, where alumni can purchase club gear online. Recently, a new committee of undergraduate members has been collaborating to completely redesign our alumni website in order to foster better connectivity with Charter alumni.

Service and Sustainability

This semester, Charter has been taking steps to reduce our environmental impact, including efforts to begin composting food waste in partnership with the University. Soon, Charter will be hosting one of our favorite events, the Chartan Auction. This event encourages members, especially new sophomores, to interact and get to know each other, in addition to raising money for charity. Last year, the auction raised over \$2,000 which was donated to a number of organizations, including St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in honor of the recent passing of Charter's longtime Head of Security, John Hammond.

Campus Presence

Our membership represents a wide range of campus involvement in clubs, organizations, teams, and academic research. Our members concentrate in over 20 different academic departments, and many serve as teaching assistants and peer tutors. We have several student-athletes who participate in at least 8 varsity and club sports teams, and approximately 70% of members have participated in intramural sports.
